"The Rising Dragon Tour" gets its name from the shape of the sightseeing route, which extends from the Noto Peninsula in Ishikawa Prefecture (the dragon's head) to Central Japan International Airport in Aichi Prefecture. Kenrokuen Garden and Kanazawa Castle Park

MAP-1

(Kanazawa)

Kanazawa Castle Park, located right next to Kenrokuen Garden, one of Japan's three most beautiful gardens, is one of the most famous hanami spots in Ishikawa Prefecture.

Cherry Blossom Season: early April (the signature Asahi cherry blossoms and Chrysanthemum cherry blossoms in Kenrokuen Garden bloom from mid to late April.)

Access: 15 minutes by bus from JR Kanazawa Station; get off the bus at "Kenrokuen-shita" and walk about one minute to Kenrokuen

Noto-Kashima Station ()

(Anamizu-machi)

Noto-Kashima Station is also called "Sakura Station" because in April it is enveloped in a tunnel of sakuras (cherry blossoms)

- Cherry Blossom Season: mid-April

 Access: Get off at Noto-Kashima Station on the Noto Railway (approx. 2 hours from JR Kanazawa Station)

Daishoji Riverboat Cruise ()



Take a slow cruise on a gondola down the historic Daishoji River, which runs through Daishoji, a castle town from the Edo Period. The man-oared gondola gives you a great view of the blossoming cherry trees on the riverbank. (Time required: about 30 minutes; boats are canceled in bad weather)

- Cherry Blossom Season: early- to mid-April
 Access: 20-minute-walk from JR Daishoji Station

Seihakusai Festival is the largest festival in the Noto. Huge festival floats called dekayama (12 meters tall, with wheels measuring 2 meters in diameter, and weighing almost 20 tons) are paraded through the narrow streets of the town.

- Dates: May 3 (Mon.) May 5 (Wed.)
- Access: Approximately 50 min. from JR Kanazawa Station to

Otabi Festival

(Komatsu, Ishikawa)


This spring festival, held at Komatsu's Ubashi Shrine and the Moto-ori Hiyoshi Shrine, is called "Otabi Matsuri". Eight festival floats (called hikiyama) are put on display throughout Komatsu City, but the main attraction is the Children's Kabuki Performance, which takes place every year on the stages inside two of the floats. Every year, about 200,000 people visit this festival.
